How did you feel when you found out that Poland and Ukraine would be hosting the European Championships?

I remember the moment like it was yesterday. I was at home, watching the news, because you always want to find out who will host such a big event. Back then I didn't know I would be playing for Poland, but I was very happy for my family in Poland. I called them and cheered!

Your first game is in the National Stadium in Warsaw, can you tell us about your thoughts ahead of this game and what you think the atmosphere will be like?

I've played in Germany and Spain and believe me – there is no other stadium like the National Stadium in Warsaw. It's a top-class venue and when it's filled with passionate fans, it's a real 12th man.

Can you tell us about your experiences of playing for Poland at home in the past? I remember my debut. It was a situation I had only dreamed of. It was great, I felt like I had opened a new, exiting chapter in my career.

Who are the teams to look out for during the Euro?

Definitely Spain. They are the current champs and they have some of the best players in the World. Germany is looking strong also. But all the teams could win; it's going to be a very competitive tournament.

Who are the players to look out for during the tournament? For me, from a midfielder point of view, definitely Anders Iniesta for Spain.

Your first game is against Greece, what do you think of them as a team and what do you think the Polish team need to do to beat them?

They are strong, and defensive-minded, so we have to be patient. We have to play our game and try to score. If we keep them from scoring, I'm sure we can win the game.

How important is it to get off to get a good start in the tournament?

It's very important. If you start well then you don't have to worry about what the other teams are doing – its vital for us.
