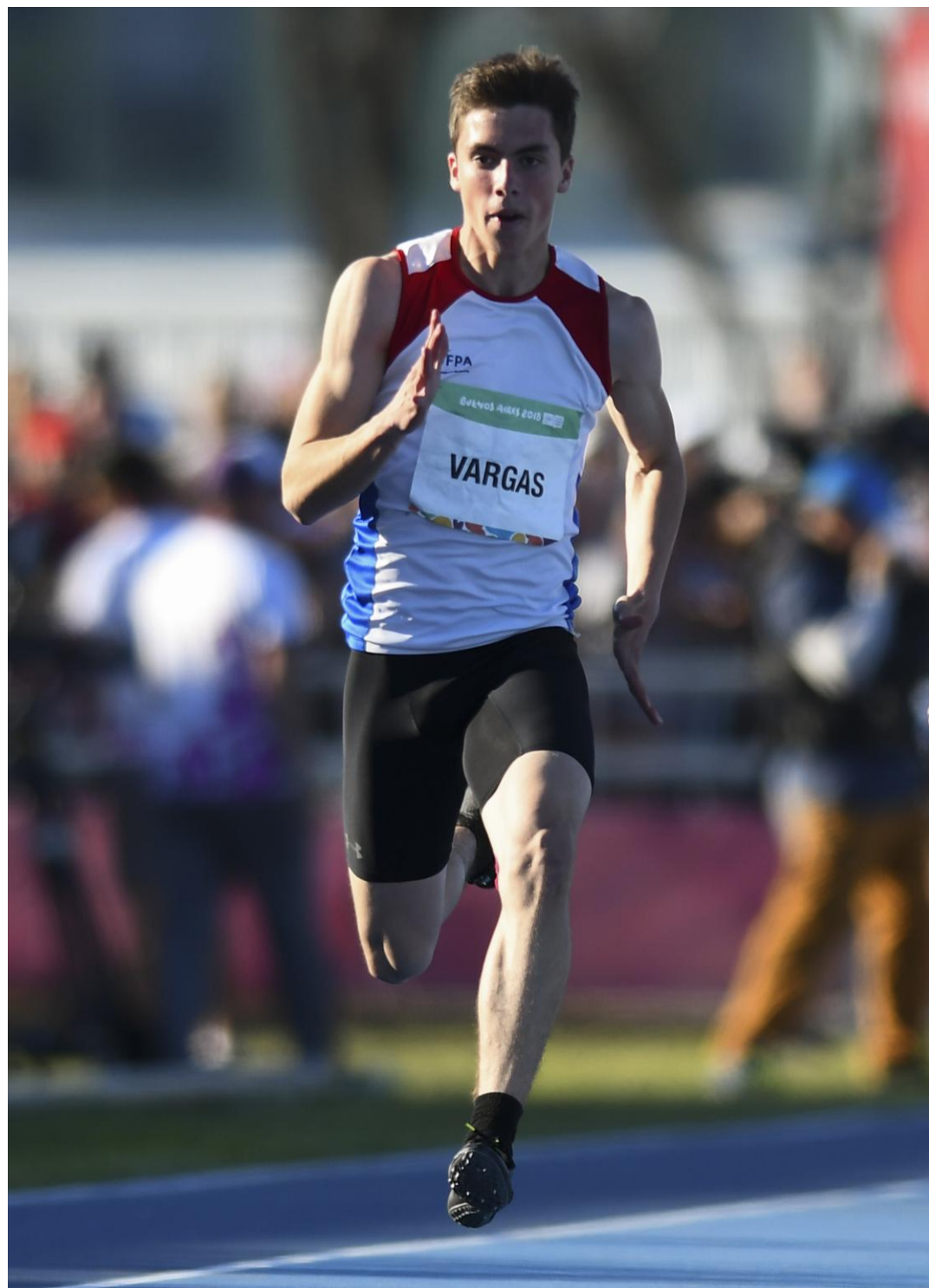

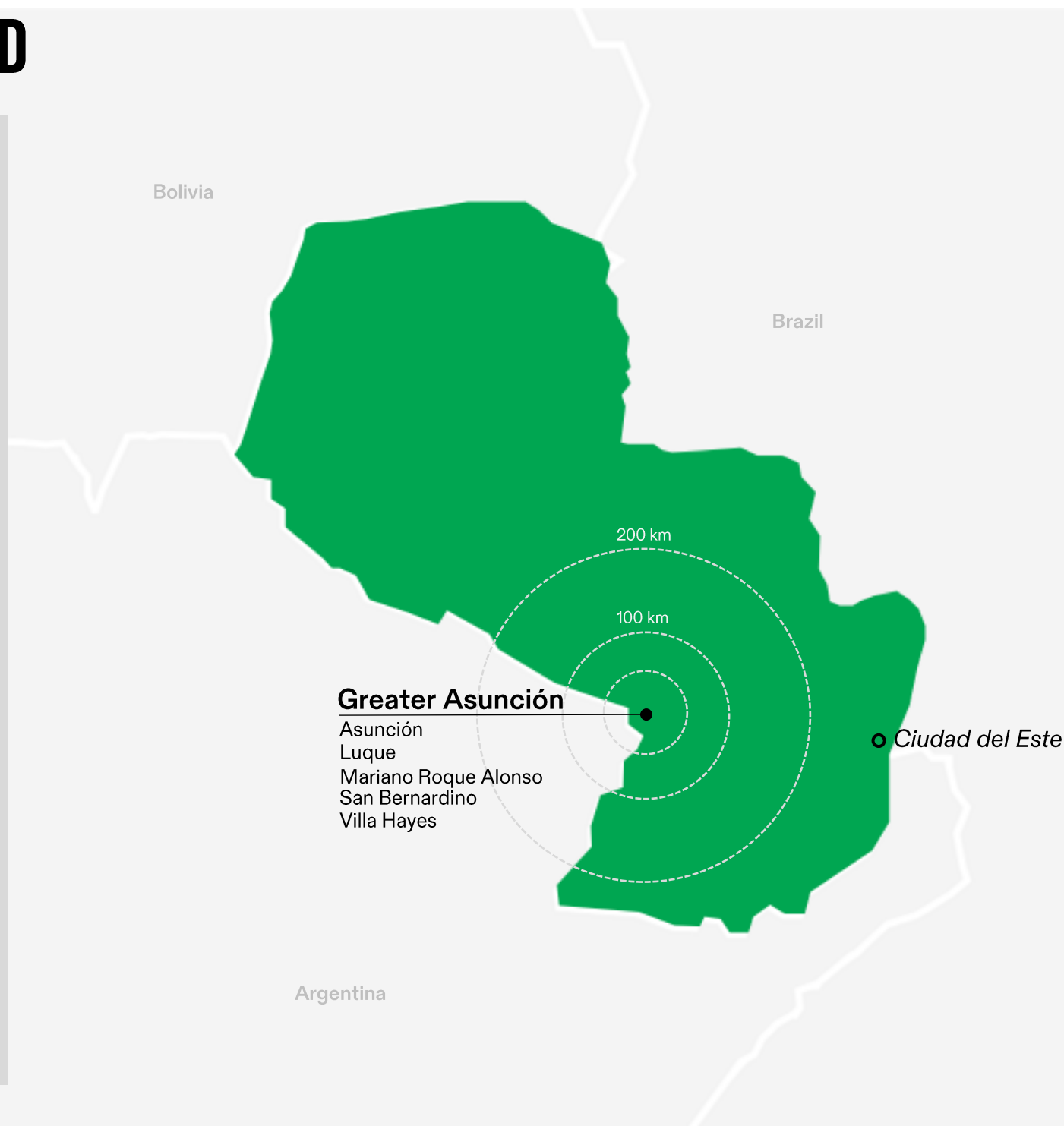

POLITICAL CONTEXT

NATIONAL LEVEL:

- Santiago Peña (Conservative Colorado Party) was elected President of Paraguay in August 2023 after a campaign during which he promised to combat crime and corruption in order to enhance national attractiveness for foreign investments. His government holds a majority of seats in both houses of Congress.
- President Peña is likely to pursue his market-friendly and export-oriented agenda even though the perception of corruption in the public sector may generate concerns and preclude more robust investment growth.
- Internationally, priorities are the renegotiation of a treaty on the price of energy with Brazil, solving commercial tensions with Argentina and strengthening ties with its US allies.

REGIONAL LEVEL:

- Óscar Rodríguez (Conservative Colorado Party) was elected Mayor of Asunción in 2019 and re-elected in 2021. Municipal elections will take place in October 2026

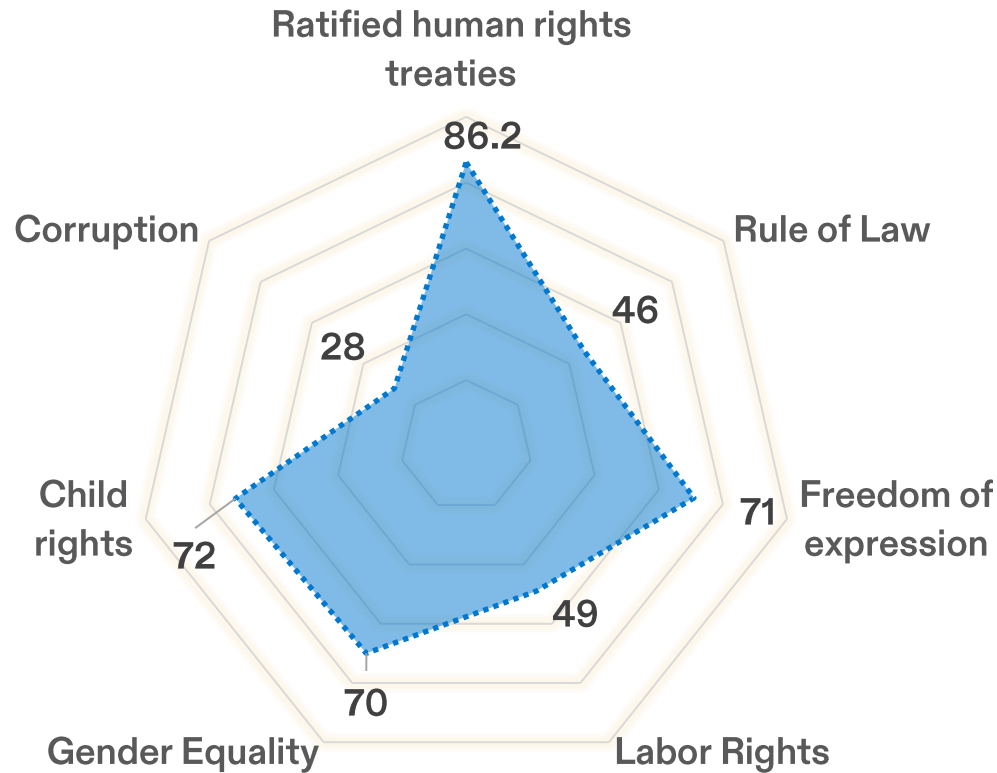

HUMAN DEVELOPMENT AND HUMAN RIGHTS CONTEXT



- Strong cooperation on **international human rights mechanisms** with government implementation of monitoring model in line with OHCHR best practices.
- Good **access to justice** including online portals available in Indigenous language.
- **Child rights** violations and poor **labour rights** enforcement in construction and services to be monitored
- Adoption of National Equity Plan to address **gender-based violence**. Inconsistent enforcement and persistent high rate of violence to women to be monitored
- While an Anti-Corruption Secretariat was established to address some risks, perception of **corruption** is high and systemic risks persist in public procurement and infrastructure delivery
- **Freedom of expression** is restricted with cases of threats and violence towards journalists investigating corruption and human rights abuses

SAFETY AND SECURITY CONTEXT

Security Forces	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The security forces have sufficient capabilities to maintain a stable security environment during the Games. - Paraguay's National Police is the primary security force. It will likely require assistance from the armed forces during major events due to capacity constraints.
Crime	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Regional organised crime groups (OCG) are operational in Paraguay, though most activities are concentrated in the tri-border area with Brazil and Argentina. - Paraguay's homicide rate is lower than the regional average. - Petty crime will remain a risk in Asunción. Aggravated robbery (using a weapon), robbery and theft are among the top ten reported crimes in the city. However, the rate of petty criminality in Paraguay is lower than its neighbouring countries; the risk level is therefore relatively low.
Terrorism	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Paraguay is not a primary target for international terrorist organisations, though the risk is likely to increase during major international events. - Latin America is a money laundering hub for terrorist groups, increasing compliance risks.
Infrastructure – Water, Telecommunication, Technological and Cyber risks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Asunción's water and telecommunication infrastructure is likely sufficient to support the mass influx of attendees for a major sporting event. - Paraguay faces a low-to-moderate threat of cyber attacks; such threats, however, will likely pose a low risk to the Youth Olympic Games.
Natural Catastrophes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Paraguay is susceptible to flooding and drought; risks are significantly elevated during the El Niño weather phenomenon

→ **Low Risk:** The Youth Olympic Games are highly likely to be declared a 'high priority' event by the Paraguayan authorities, who would be capable of delivering safe and secure YOG

VISION

The vision for hosting the YOG in Asunción is **to leverage the transformative power of sport to inspire the youth, accelerate social and sustainable development and showcase the dynamism of Paraguay to the world**

- The YOG would promote a lasting sports culture in Paraguay, the country with the youngest demographics in South America
- The event would contribute to fostering a more inclusive and value-driven society and bring cohesion across the country
- YOG is a platform to position the country as a fast-growing economy and a destination for international sports events



LEGACY

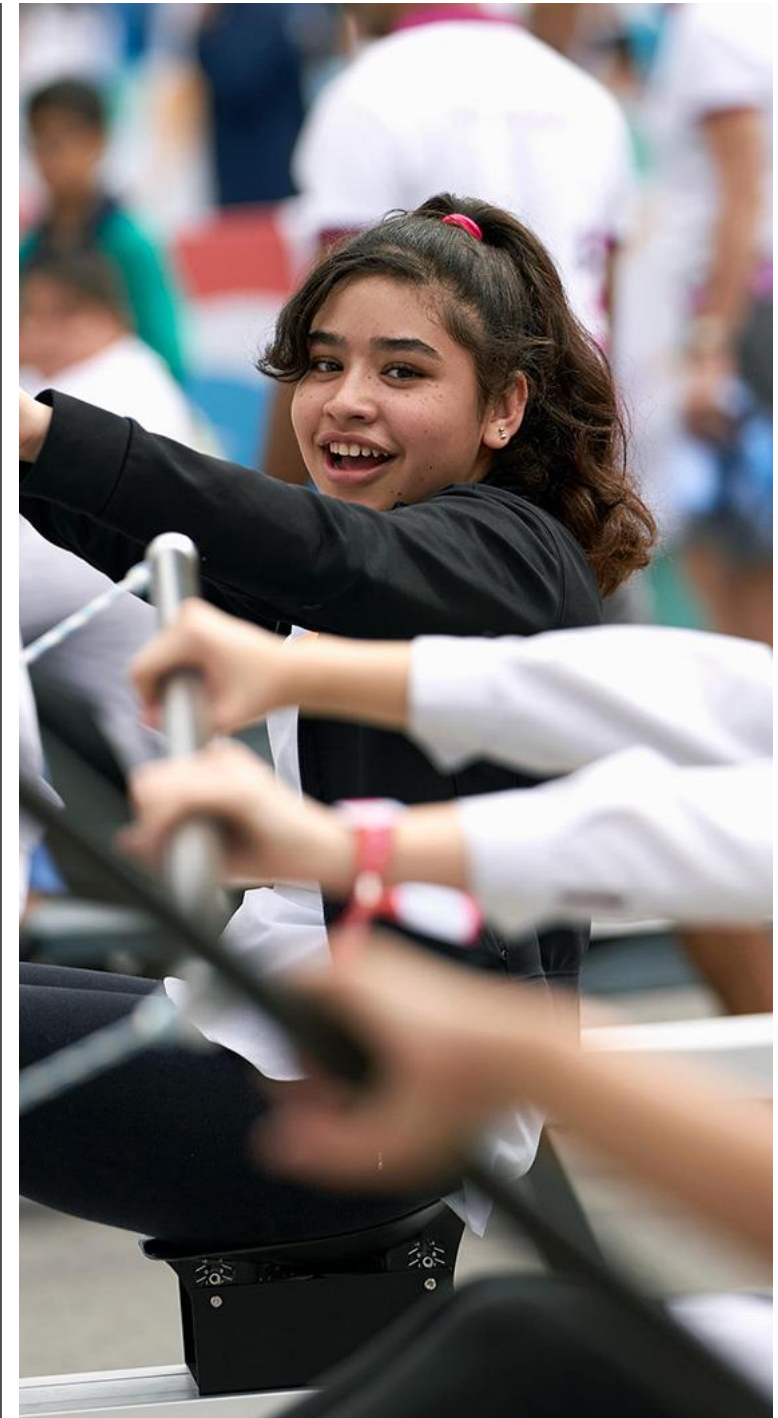
Hosting the YOG in Paraguay in 2030 would help generate **long term socio-economic benefits** in a wide range of areas:

- **Sports, Education and Health benefits:**

- Fostering greater physical activity for the next generation and inspiring local children to practise Olympic sports in school through dedicated engagement and initiation programmes
- Providing a better approach to nutrition

- **Social benefits:**

- Addressing the need for more affordable housing for the lower-middle class and catalysing the development of new units in Asunción (planned irrespective of the YOG)
- Building pride and cohesion across the country through a national project



ALIGNMENT WITH EXISTING SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLANS

To achieve its legacy objectives, Paraguay can leverage existing social and sports programmes and policies.

The programmes that will be enhanced in the context of YOG include:

- **Sumar+:** a programme that facilitates access to sports for children with underprivileged backgrounds
- **Open School:** initiative that offers sport and cultural activities to all students, promoting equal educational opportunities
- **Zero Hunger:** food programme that provides inclusive approach to nutrition for all children
- **High Performance Plan:** programme that supports athlete development, talent identification, and the creation of a National Games, with the aim of decentralising the practice of sport across the whole country

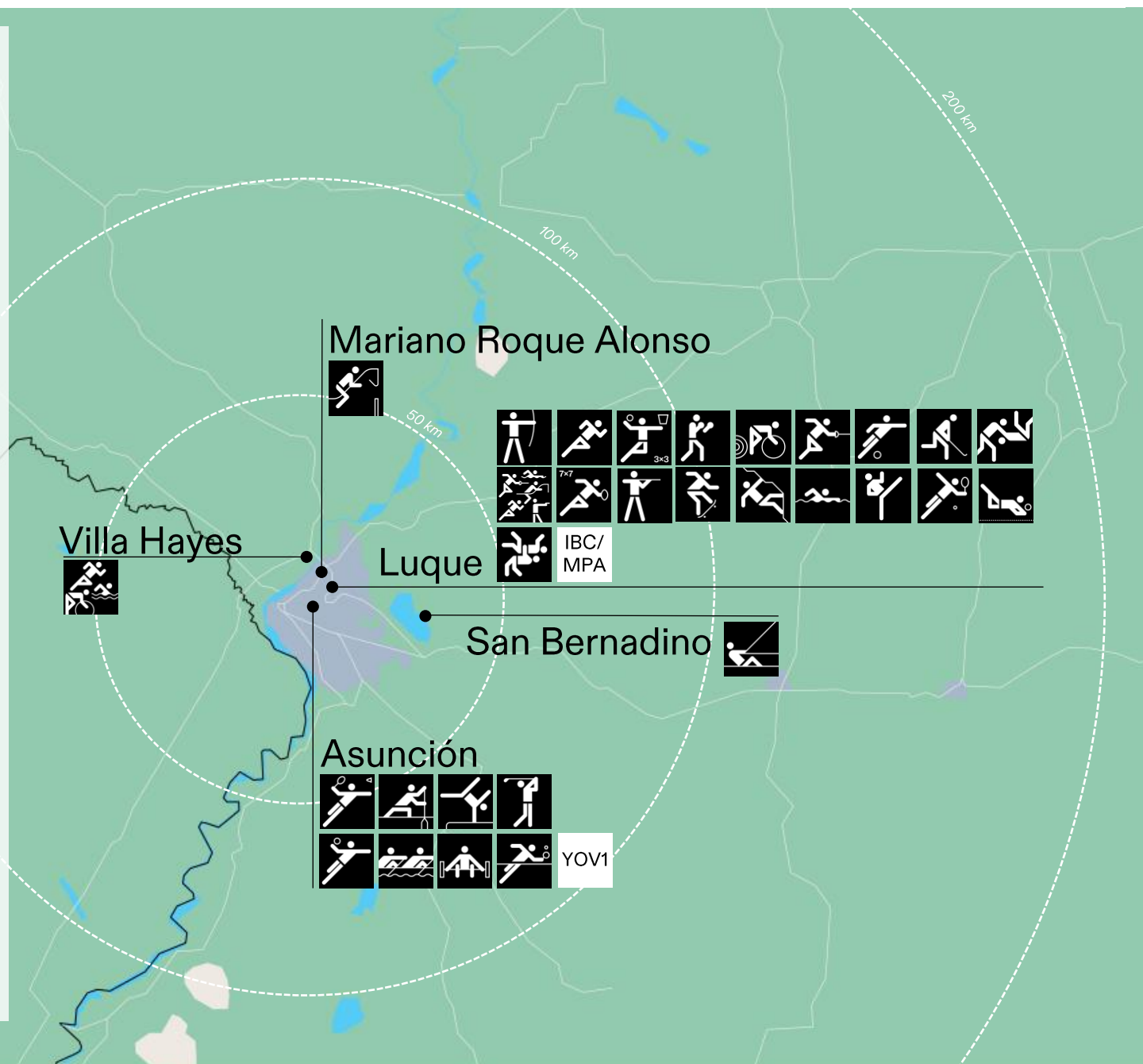

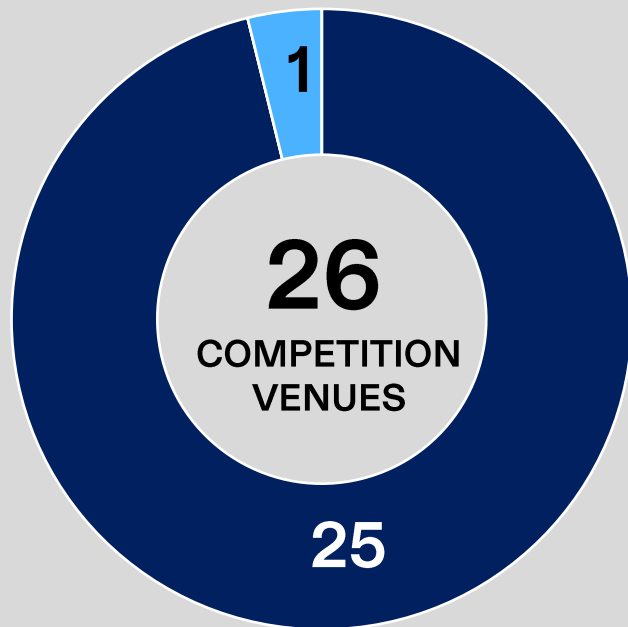

Asunción	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 13 residential towers with a capacity of 10,000 beds (peak occupancy during YOG estimated at 5,800 people) • Village located within 30 minutes of all competition venues (except rowing) • Planned development project, irrespective of the YOG, in a fast-growing neighbourhood of Asunción. The tender process will start in 2026 with a delivery planned for 2029 • Project funded through a public-private partnership with the National Government (Ministry of Urban Planning, Housing and Habitat) providing the land to a private developer • The same Village is proposed to be used for the Panam Games in 2031. The apartment units would then be sold on the market

VENUE MASTERPLAN: SUMMARY

OPPORTUNITIES

- 100% existing or temporary venues, with concept leveraging the masterplan of the 2025 Junior Pan American Games
- The proposed concept around one cluster in Asunción would ensure festive celebrations of YOG
- All athletes sharing one main Youth Olympic Village in the centre of Asunción, ensuring an excellent YOG experience:
 - 100% sports (30 of 30 sports) are within one hour of the main Youth Olympic Village
 - 96% of venues within 30 minutes of the Youth Olympic Village
 - All proposed sports/venues within a perimeter of 20 km
- Development of Youth Olympic Village aligned with urban development plans

AREAS TO MONITOR

- High concentration of venues (15) at COP Olympic Park would require careful management of spectator flows
- Development and construction of Youth Olympic Village

WORLD CUPS

- Paraguay hosted the **South American Games 2022** (~4,500 athletes) and **Junior Pan American Games** (~4,000 athletes) in August 2025 in Asunción.
- Paraguay was awarded the **Pan-American Games 2031** in October 2025
- Paraguay has hosted **3 World Cups** in **2 out of 31** Olympic summer sports.
- In **2 of the 30 disciplines** proposed for the YOG 2030, Paraguay has organised at least one World Championship or World Cup.
- Paraguay has participated in **all three Summer Youth Olympic Games** since 2010.

- Paraguay has some experience in organising and hosting major international summer sport events and has gained relevant experience in hosting multi sports events.
- Asunción benefits from an existing permanent organising committee of over 100 employees that organises annual events

TRANSPORT

TRANSPORT STRATEGY

- The transport strategy for Paraguay's YOG 2030 project is based on a dedicated electric bus shuttle system, connecting key Olympic venues through optimised routes and priority lanes, where possible. It will be delivered by the YOGOC to ensure it operates independently and does not interfere with the public transport services.

TRANSPORT INFRASTRUCTURE

- Asunción's public transport is mostly based on bus services connecting the city with the metropolitan region. Multiple bus routes connect the venues with the athletes' village and city centre.
- Although Asunción is not listed in the TomTom traffic index, it is considered a congested city, given the rapid population growth in recent decades, the expansion of urban areas, and a rising number of vehicles on the roads. However, several improvements to roads, public transport infrastructure and smart traffic systems are planned for 2026 to 2028.
- In addition to the existing bus system, a commuter train system is currently being built, which is also expected to be completed by 2028. It will include a stop at the Olympic Park and will serve as a key axis for Games-time movements across the city.

- Paraguay's transport strategy for the YOG mostly builds on bus services and leverages already planned infrastructure projects, including the construction of a commuter train line.
- All venues will be accessible by shuttle bus.

AIRPORT

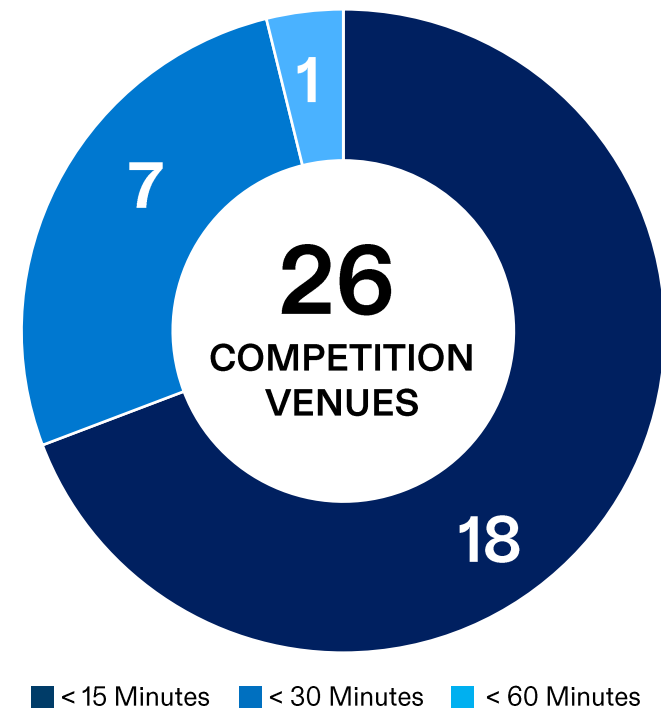
- The “Aeropuerto Internacional Silvio Pettirossi” (ASU) is the main international and domestic gateway in Paraguay. In 2024, it handled approx. 1.1 million passengers and served a total of 12 airlines.

DISTANCES AND TRAVEL TIMES

- All athletes will be accommodated in close proximity to their respective venues, ensuring minimum distances and travel times.
- The average travel time to the venues in Asunción, Luque, Mariano Roque Alonso and Villa Hayes will be 14 minutes. The sailing venue in San Bernardino can be reached within 60 minutes.

- Airport capacity and airlines are limited and might result in longer inbound and outbound journey times for stakeholders.
- The venue concept is extremely compact, resulting in very short distances and travel times for all athletes. Even the athletes competing in sailing in San Bernardino can reach the competition venue within one hour which will allow them to stay in the YOV in Asunción.

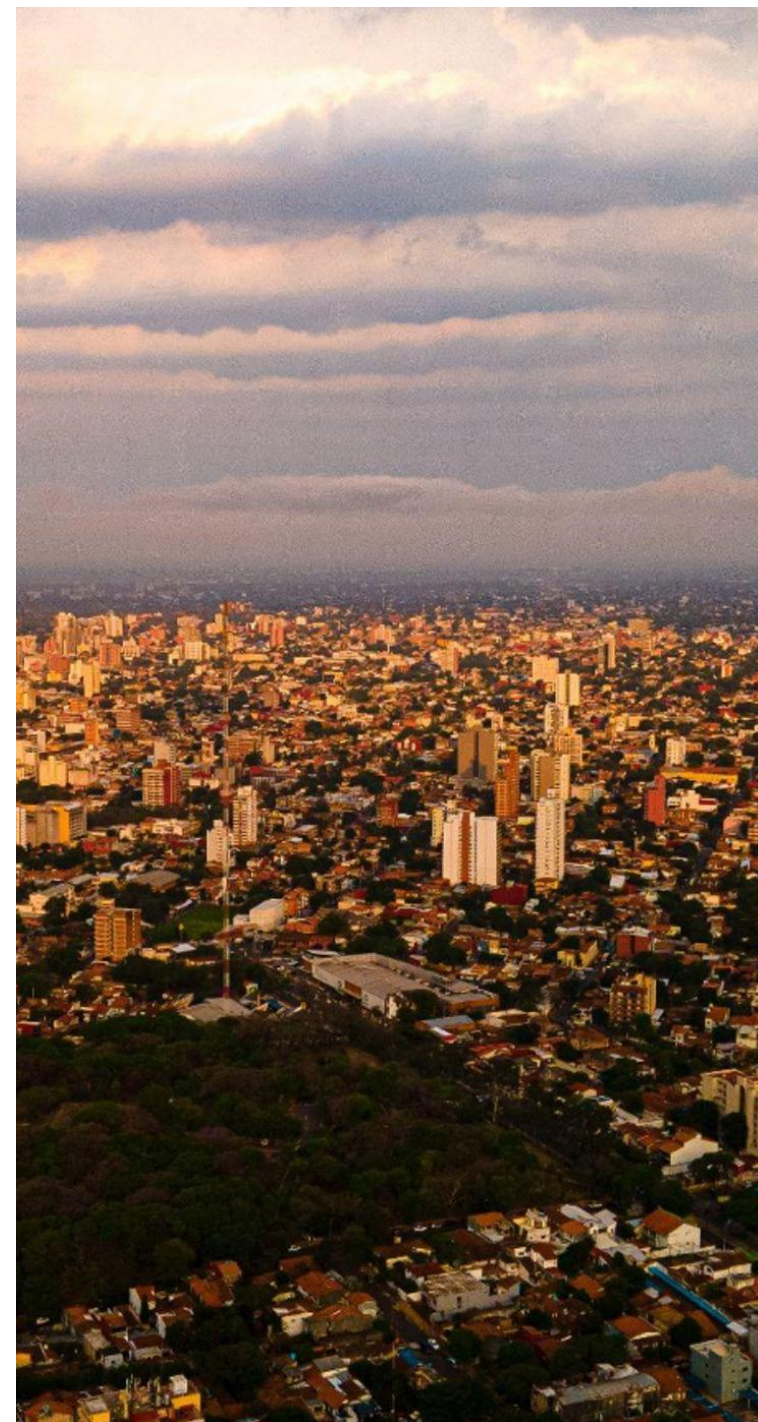

GAMES DELIVERY: SUMMARY

OPPORTUNITIES

- Paraguay has some experience in hosting major sports events and has hosted multi-sports events including the South American Games 2022 and Junior Pan American Games 2025 in Asunción, which provided local workforce with opportunities to gain experience
- Good climatic conditions for athletes in October (proposed period for the YOG)
- Transport infrastructure is planned to improve in the coming years until 2030, and transport infrastructure and capacities would adequately meet YOG needs
- Distances and travel times for the athletes to the competition venues are very short, making the proposed concept very convenient and athlete-friendly
- Possibility to leverage existing permanent organising committee (over 100 employees) that delivers annual sport events in Paraguay

AREAS TO MONITOR

- Careful resources management would be required to deliver both a YOG in 2030 and the Pan American Games in 2031
- Airport capacity and airlines operating at the “Aeropuerto Internacional Silvio Pettirossi” (ASU) are limited and might result in longer inbound and outbound journey times for stakeholders
- Traffic in Asunción is considerably congested. Travel times will depend on careful transport planning and successful implementation of transport improvements
- Room inventory is rather limited to accommodate all stakeholders

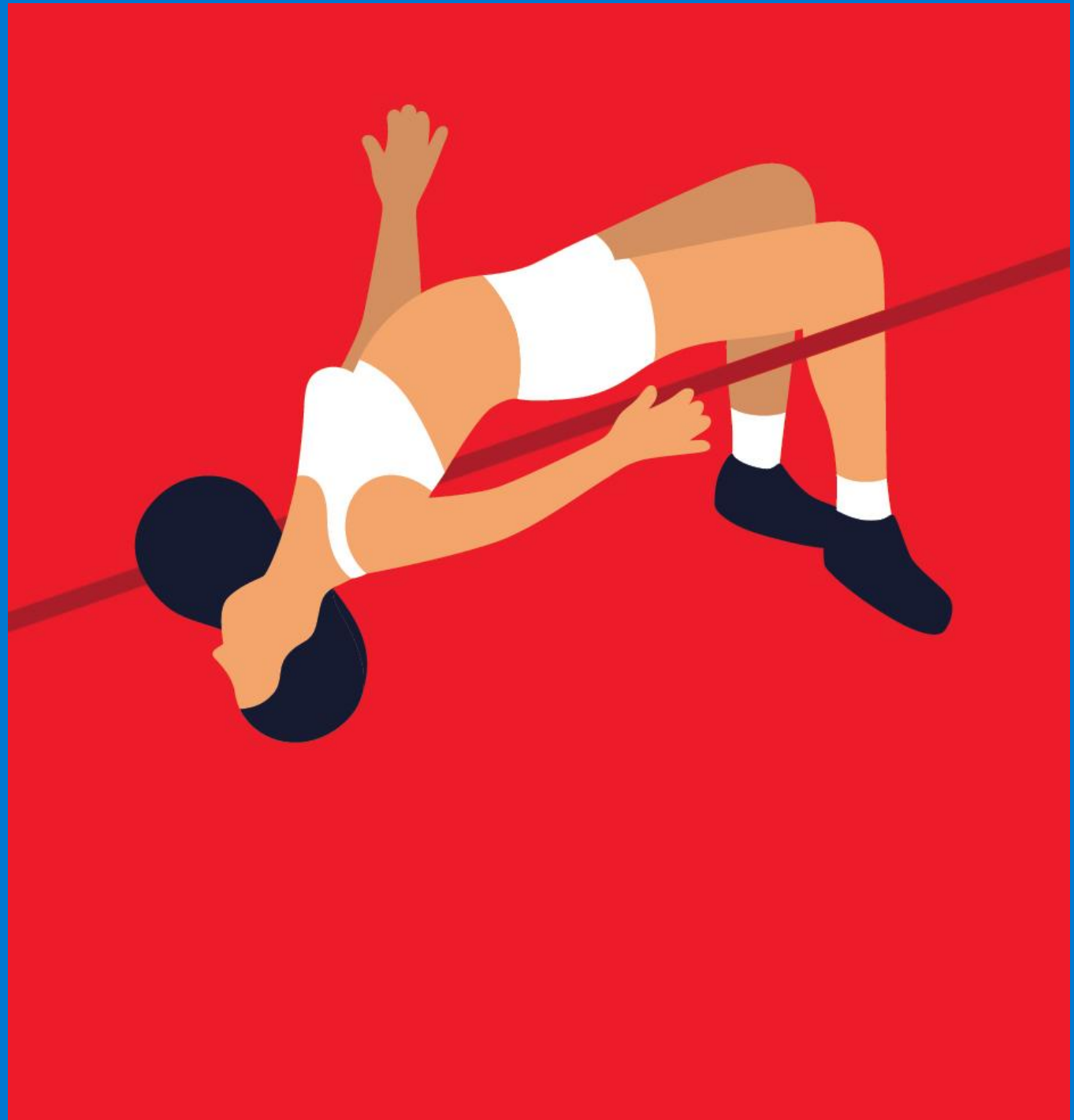

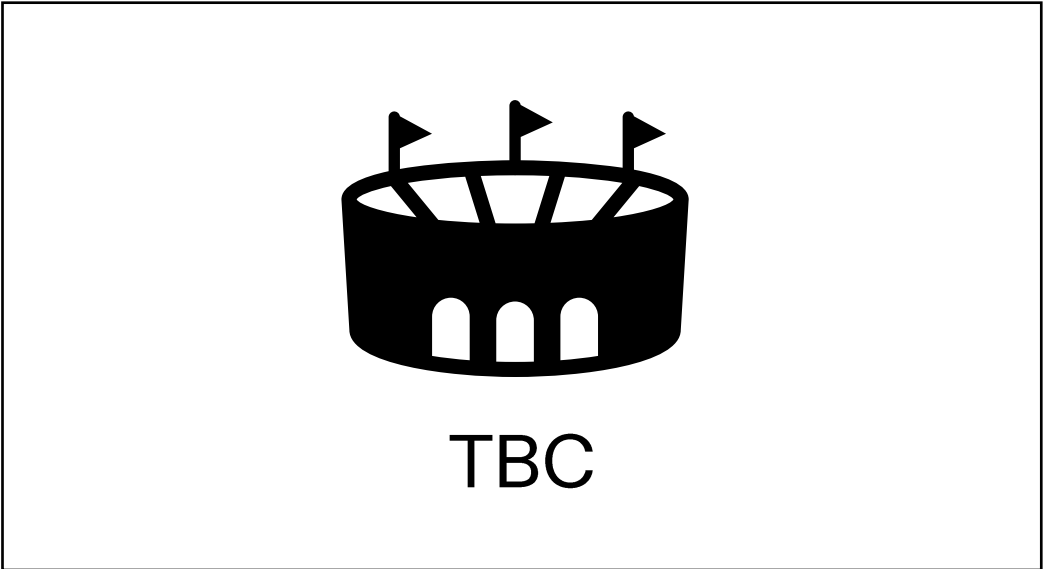
