00:10	Archive b-roll of Sun Hung Kai/Scallywag and images of Leg 7 start in Auckland	<p><i>In the early afternoon (UTC) on Monday, Team Sun Hung Kai Scallywag reported a man overboard during Leg 7 of the 2017 18 Volvo Ocean Race.</i></p> <p><i>The fleet had left Auckland a week earlier, racing towards Itajaí Brazil.</i></p> <p><i>With approximately 1,400 miles to go to Cape Horn, skipper David Witt's team was sailing in strong gale force winds with an accompanying sea state of 5 meters, when John Fisher went overboard.</i></p>
00:30	Richard Brisius Volvo Ocean Race President	<p><i>IV</i></p> <p><i>"I am very saddened to let you know that, we've lost one of our crew members in the Volvo Ocean Race, John Fisher. We were informed by the Sun Hung Kai Scallywag sailing team that they had a man overboard situation, and they immediately started a search and rescue operation, and carried this out under very difficult circumstances, with big waves, big winds and cold conditions. But after several hours of searching, the crew on Scallywag decided to abandon their search operation. And this is of course a terribly sad moment for all of us, first and foremost our thoughts are with John Fisher's family, and with crew members on board Sun Hung Kai/Scallywag.</i></p>
01:26	Phil Lawrence Race Director Volvo Ocean Race	<p><i>IV</i></p> <p><i>"So the main focus now is to get the boat safely to the Chilean coast, and into a port in Chile. They are still in very difficult sea conditions, race control are supporting them all of the way, planning a safe routing for them, keeping them updated and monitoring their progress. The other teams are also in very difficult conditions, gale force winds approaching Cape Horn, so they have a lot on at the moment. We had sent them a short notice, notifying them of what had happened, and this morning we had notified them that sadly John had not been found.</i></p>
01:58	Archive b-roll of Sun Hung Kai/Scallywag including John Fisher sailing; route animation and b-roll of the rest of the fleet	<p><i>The entire Volvo Ocean Race community extends its thoughts and prayers to John Fisher's family, friends and team mates.</i></p> <p><i>Team Sun Hung Kai/Scallywag is now heading towards the coast of Chile, the nearest landfall, while the Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre has diverted a commercial ship to pass through the search area.</i></p> <p><i>Race control had informed the fleet on the situation and updated them on the rescue efforts conducted by Sun Hung Kai/Scallywag and the Marine Rescue Coordination Centre (MRCC).</i></p> <p><i>The news about John Fisher has been devastating. The veteran ocean racer had friends across the fleet, and tributes are coming in from each of the boats.</i></p>
